HIHI's homeless shelter will begin again in December. This year we will be hosting 12 Friday nights right here at St. Elizabeth. Since 2004, faith communities in the Town of Huntington have sheltered the homeless at sites throughout the Town, offering dinner and a warm bed every night during the winter. Volunteers provide comfort and companionship to these folks who might otherwise not make it through the winter.

- ⇒ Training will be provided.
- ⇒ Minimum of 2 volunteers on site at all times.

**Here's how you can help on shelter Fridays:**

- ⇒ SET UP: Make bed and set up for dinner (5:30 to 7:00 p.m.)
- ⇒ PROVIDE DINNER: Prepare dinner for 30; bring to shelter site by 6:00 p.m. (can be shared).
- ⇒ SERVE DINNER/KITCHEN CLEAN UP: 6:30 to 8:30 p.m.
- ⇒ EVENING CHAPERONE: 8:30 p.m. to 12:00 midnight
- ⇒ OVERNIGHT CHAPERONE: Midnight to 5:45 a.m. (Men only.)
- ⇒ PREPARE BREAKFAST: Provide & cook hot breakfast for up to 30 (4:30 to 6:30 a.m.)
- ⇒ MORNING HELPERS: clean up breakfast; break down bedding (clean-up volunteers can start at 5:45 a.m.)
- ⇒ LAUNDRY: off site; pick up laundry on Saturday morning, return by the following Thursday.
